## How to read the Tariff Concessions Gazette

Below is an example of a Tariff Concession Order application acceptance notification.

The Tariff Classification of goods is an eight digit code under the <u>Customs Tariff Act</u> 1995.

TCO wording must be generic and worded in such a way that will allow officers to identify the goods when they arrive in Australia.

The number 50 indicates Item 50 in Schedule 4 of *Customs Tariff Act 1995*, and provides a legal backing to accepting and making TCOs.




